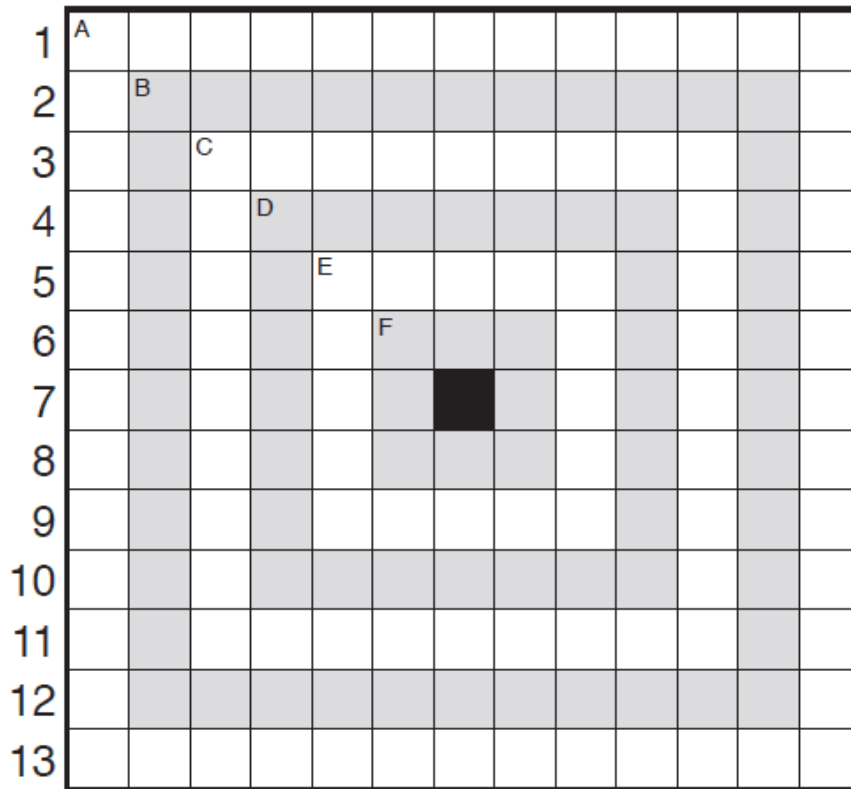


# MARCHING BANDS

In this puzzle, each row contains two adjacent words, defined in order in clues 1-13. These are crossed by continuous trains of words in the square bands lettered A-F. The words in each band are clued in order, with the first word starting in the appropriately lettered square and then proceeding clockwise.
